Safety on Campus

The Richmond Hill campus offers 24-hour security from Reception in the Main Building and a patrol of area satellite residences. All University buildings include extensive 24-hour CCTV. Campus security is currently managed by the Sodexo Group.

Our Post Graduate Centre at 37 Kensington High Street (37 KHS) offers building security from 8:00 to 17:00 Monday through Friday. During term time, in house security provide additional cover after hours to mitigate lone working risks.

All members of the Richmond Community including Students, Academic and Professional Staff and any visitors or contractors are expected to visibility wear University IDs when on campus. ID cards are required to access most doors and some facilities as well as being visual indicators that an individual has a right to be on campus. If anyone on campus is seen without ID or acting suspiciously, a security officer should be contacted immediately at the front desk.

Keeping Safe on Campus

1. While you are on campus, please wear your ID visibly at all times. This allows staff to easily identify you and easily shows who is a visitor. If you are asked to show your ID, please comply with the request. This is for YOUR safety.
2. If you plan on hosting a visitor or an overnight guest, please follow our policies. All guests must check in through our security office and should wear visible ID at all times.
3. Until further information about the incident becomes available, avoid crowded squares and public areas where people gather. Always report suspicious behaviour to a police officer. The emergency number in the UK is 999. Our security office on campus can be reach by dialling 020 8332 8230.
4. If you are a US citizen, you should register with the US State Department Smart Traveller Enrollment Programme [here](#). This programme identifies US citizens travelling abroad and alerts them to possible dangers. Should you lose your passport or run into other difficulties, support will be expedited if you are registered with STEP.UK and EU citizens may wish to consult the Travel Advisory of the Foreign and Commonwealth Office: <https://www.gov.uk/foreign-travel-advice>

Students from other countries should check with their local embassies about travel alerts to stay abreast of events.

5. If you plan to travel outside of London, please alert staff in the Student Affairs office and let your peers know. It is always better to travel with friends than to travel alone. Stay in contact with family back home and let them know where you are going and when you will be returning.

6. Don't be afraid to alert a staff member to someone or something that appears suspicious or unusual. Most crimes are crimes of opportunity, but if there is no opportunity, there can be no crime!
7. If you feel unsafe, concerned or worried, please let us know. We're here to help!

Reporting an incident on campus

Incident Reports are an important tool for assessing the safety of the Richmond Community. In the event of an incident, which could be any sort of disturbance, disruption or emergency including medical, please contact a member of security immediately.

The security staff member will then ascertain the severity of the incident and escalate as necessary.

It is essential you report any incident and/or accident you witness on campus to ensure the continued safety of all students, academic and administrative staff and visitors that use Richmond University facilities.

What is the Clery Act?¹

The Clery Act is a US federal law titled Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act (1998) which requires statistics on crimes reported on or close to campus to be reported annually with a report published 1 October to students and the general public.

Clery Act crime reporting is not strictly limited to incidents occurring on campus or within campus buildings or residences. In addition to on campus and on campus housing areas, institutions must also include statistics for crimes which occur on public property within campus bounds, public property immediately adjacent to the campus and non-campus buildings owned or controlled by the organisation that are used for education purposes and frequently used by students but not a part of the core campus or those owned or controlled by a student organisation officially recognised by the University.

Wherever crimes occur, the University must maintain a daily crime log of all reported crimes that fall within their jurisdiction. This crime log must be made available to the public during daily business hours.

In summary, the basic responsibilities of an institution under the Clery Act include:

- Collect, classify and count crime reports and statistics;
- Issue campus alerts and warning notices;
- Publish an Annual Security Report (Oct 1);
- Disclose missing student notification procedures, when applicable;

- Submit crime and fire statistics to the Department of Education, when applicable;
- Disclose procedures for institutional disciplinary actions;
- Provide educational programmes and campaigns;
- Keep a daily crime log, when applicable;
- Disclose fire safety information, when applicable.
